In the fourth century, Nicholas was Bishop of Myra in modern-day Turkey. He was a very kind man and had a reputation for helping the poor and giving secret gifts to people in need. There are many legends about Nicholas, the most famous one you will hear in this service. Because of his kindness and goodness Nicholas was eventually made a saint.

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT
